It is capable to devising and testing hundreds of potential means of plant protection with a speed that nowadays still lies out of reach of many scientists. The robot is a culmination of a five-year-long

joint project between scientists, engineers and programmers. It is able to produce small amounts of any liquid agrochemical substance and implement a series of tests to determine the expediency of further research.

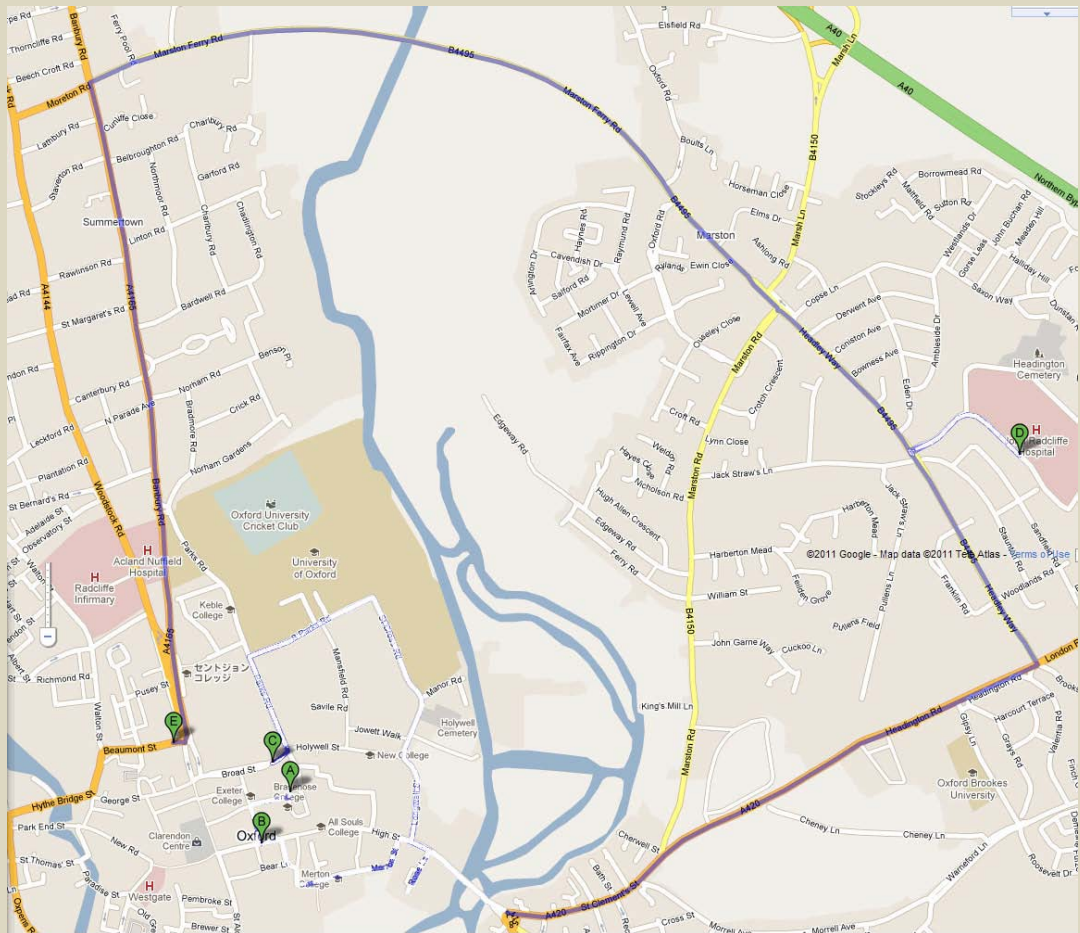
